I closely watched the paths of *the violent*.

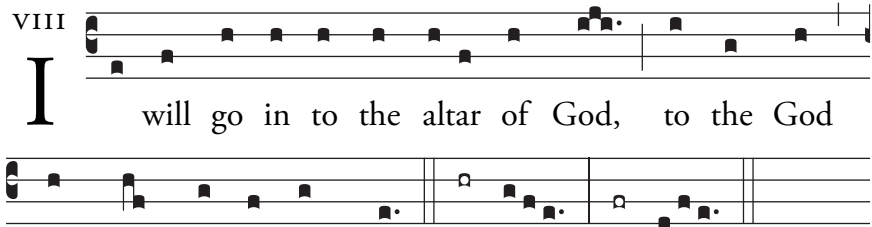
4. Guard me as the apple of your eye. †

my saving presence *and my God*.


