


## SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY

### INTROIT

*Deus in loco sancto suo*

*Ps 68 (67): 6, 7, 36*



**G** <sup>V</sup>OD is in his ho-ly dwelling place; \* the God  
who causes us to dwell to-gether, one at heart, in his  
house; he himself will give power and strength to his  
people.

### Psalm 68 (67)

1. Let God arise; let his foes *be scattered*. \*  
Let those who hate him flee from *his presence*.  
As smoke is driven away, so drive them away; †  
like wax that melts before *the fire*, \*  
so the wicked shall perish at the presence *of God*.
2. But the just shall rejoice at the presence *of God*; \*  
they shall exult with glad *rejoicing*.  
O sing to God; make music to his name. †  
Extol the One who rides on *the clouds*. \*  
The LORD is his name; exult at *his presence*.

3. I said to myself in my *good fortune*: \*  
“I shall never *be shaken*.”  
O LORD, your favor had set me like a *mountain stronghold*. \*  
Then you hid your face, and I was put *to confusion*.
4. To you, O LORD, *I cried*, \*  
to my God I *appealed for mercy*:  
“What profit is my lifeblood, my going to *the grave*? \*  
Can dust give you thanks, or *proclaim your faithfulness*?”

together let us *praise his name*.  
I sought the LORD, and he *answered me*; \*

3. Look towards him *and be radiant*; \*  
let your faces not *be abashed*.  
This lowly one called; *the LORD heard*, \*  
and rescued him from all *his distress*.

4. The angel of the LORD *is encamped* \*  
around those who fear *him, to rescue* them.

5. The LORD is close to the *brokenhearted;* \*

1. Blessed the man who *fears the LORD,* \*  
who takes great delight in *his commandments.*

His descendants shall be *powerful on earth;* \*  
the generation of the upright *will be blest.*

Psalm 31 (30)

1. In you, O LORD, *I take refuge*. \*  
Let me never be put *to shame*.  
In your justice, *set me free*; \*  
incline your ear to me, and *speedily* rescue me.
2. Be a rock of *refuge for me*, \*  
a mighty stronghold *to save me*.  
For you are my *rock, my stronghold!* \*  
Lead me, guide me, for the sake of *your name*.
3. Release me from the snare *they have hidden*, \*  
for you indeed are *my refuge*.  
Into your hands I *commend my spirit*. \*  
You will redeem me, O LORD, O *faithful God*.

4. Let me be glad and rejoice in your mercy, †  
for you who have seen *my affliction* \*  
and taken heed of my soul's *distress*.

Be strong, let your *heart take courage*, \*  
all who hope in *the LORD*.
