

When there are two lessons before the Gospel, the chants are ordered in this way : after the first lesson, the Responsorial Psalm is sung ; after the second lesson, either the Alleluiatic Psalm or the antiphon Alleluia with its verses is sung.

When there is one lesson before the Gospel, only one of the following chants is chosen ad libitum.

This plan is followed throughout the Time Through the Year.
